“Creative Connections” to Feature Vienna Boys’ Choir Documentary

(SPRINGFIELD, OH) –The Springfield Arts Council’s and Clark County Historical Society’s admission-free “Creative Connection Series” continues with the free DVD screening of **“Silk Road – Songs Along the Road and Time”** on Thursday, November 17 at 7:30 PM at the Heritage Center of Clark County, 117 S. Fountain Ave., in downtown Springfield.

Produced by Kurt and Patrick Faudon and directed by Kurt Faudon, **“Silk Road – Songs Along the Road and Time”** chronicles The Vienna Boys’ Choir, one of the most famous choirs in the world, in a multi-layered film which takes us on a journey around the globe and even back into time. We experience the boys’ nomadic lifestyle through their very own eyes, including music from the Vienna Boys’ Choir’s five-century history, as well as the choir’s project involving music from the Silk Road. The message is that we all share the same part in life; what matters is how you fill your time “along the road.”

Through special arrangement with the film’s director, **“Silk Road – Songs Along the Road and Time”** DVD will be available for purchase following the screening.

This “Creative Connections” program is presented admission-free. Seating is limited and is first-come, first-served.

The “Creative Connections Series” is presented by the Springfield Arts Council in partnership with the Clark County Historical Society, connecting unique performing artists with events of cultural and historic significance. Upcoming “Creative Connections” performances include:

- **Thursday, December 8, 7:30 PM – “The Gift of the Magi”** – A live dramatization of the O. Henry holiday classic, performed by Cincinnati ArtReach.
- **Wednesday, January 18, 7:30 PM – “Jump Back, Honey: The Poetry of Herbert Woodward Martin”** – Video screening of documentary featuring interviews with U.D. Professor Herbert Woodward Martin and discussion of the work of Paul Laurence Dunbar.
- **Thursday, April 19, 7:30 PM – “Osebo’s Drum”** – an interactive live performance by Lincoln Center Teaching Artist Robbi Kumalo, combining traditional folk tales with rhythm and music.
